Information on the round-table discussions during the high level segment

The SBI, at its eighteenth session, endorsed the dates of 10 to 11 December 2003 for the high-level segment to be attended by ministers and other heads of delegation. The SBI also recommended that round-table discussions be the mode of exchange during the high level segment.

The Bureau subsequently agreed that three round-table discussions will be convened on the following themes:

- (1) Climate change, adaptation, mitigation and sustainable development*
- (2) Technology, including technology use and development and transfer of technologies*
- (3) Assessment of progress at the national, regional and international levels to fulfil the promise and objective enshrined in the climate change agreements, including the scientific, information, policy and financial aspects.*

The President will call on several colleagues to assist him in co-chairing the round-table discussions:
